News had been received of the deaths of **Nicholas** (D A Nicholls), the "to" half of **Peto** (Helen "Toto" Williams), and **Bart** (J B Widdowson).

After the meal, Peter Rhodes (**Bufo**) started the talking with a preamble in which he welcomed everybody and had the first dig at the recent **Amicus** puzzle that attracted only 8 correct solutions. He then handed over to Chris Feetenby (**Corylus**) who made a short speech before proposing the toast to absent friends. He then announced the winner of the Solver Silver Salver.

Unfortunately, **Mime** was not present to receive the trophy.
